- 1. Minutes of the Regular Council Meeting of City of Steinbach Council held on Tuesday, June 20, 2017, at City of Steinbach Council Chambers.
- 2. Mayor Chris Goertzen called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m., with the following members of Council present: Councillors Earl Funk, Michael Zwaagstra, Jac Siemens, John Fehr, Susan Penner and Cari Penner. Also present: City Manager, Troy Warkentin, City Clerk, Deb Rempel and Director of Finance, Brian Hrehirchuk.
- 3. Councillor Cari Penner opened the meeting.

6. City Manager, Troy Warkentin provided a report regarding the holiday opening hours of the Steinbach Aquatic Centre. A general review of the Centre's activity around holidays was completed. It was found that should the City open on additional holidays during the year, it would result in a larger deficit for the facility. City Manager recommended that should City Council's direction be that the facility be open on additional holidays to the current openings, that it be limited to a day or days that demonstrate the greatest public demand and potential revenue generation.

Owner: Russell Penner

Applicant: Three Way Builders Ltd

- Purpose: 1. To allow a total of 32 parking stalls whereas Zoning By-Law 2055 requires a minimum of 50 parking stalls;
- 2. To allow a parking aisle width of 20 feet whereas Zoning By-Law 2055 requires the parking aisle width to be 25 feet.
- 8.1 City Manager, Troy Warkentin, introduced Variance V-2017-08 and reported that notices pursuant to The Planning Act had been completed.
- 8.2 No letters of correspondence were received.
- 8.3 Mr. Leonard Neufeld, 320 PTH 12 North representing Three Way Builders, the applicant on behalf of Russell Penner was present at the hearing and provided that Keystone Agri-Motive (2005) Inc. is currently undergoing an expansion. They are requesting a variance to allow for less parking and have a smaller parking aisle, than what is required under Zoning By-Law 2055. The applicant has determined that 32 parking stalls are sufficient for the business. Mr. Neufeld referred to Zoning By-Law 2055
