Purpose

City Manager Report

The applicant is seeking Council approval under file CU-2026-05 to permit the site to be used for the outside storage of vehicles as a principal use. Pursuant to Steinbach Zoning By-Law 2245, the outside storage of vehicles as a principal use is a conditional use in the M1 - Light Industrial Zone.

The proposed use appears to be consistent with the permitted uses in the neighborhood with the surrounding areas also zoned as M1 - Light Industrial. There would not appear to be any negative impacts of the proposed use on the surrounding area.

Recommendation is to approve the application subject to the outcome of the public hearing.

The Light Industrial (M1) district is intended to provide for light manufacturing, processing, service, storage, wholesale, and distribution operations with all operations contained within an enclosed building with some limited outside storage.

Comments/Recommendation

The applicant is applying to allow outdoor storage of vehicles on the subject property. As per Zoning By-Law 2245, outdoor storage as a principal use is a conditional use. The applicant indicated that the site is to be used for MPI vehicles. The site is part of an industrial condominium with similar uses occurring on the other units. The applicant has indicated they intend on adjusting the existing fence to ensure that the vehicles cannot be seen from the road. The use of parking vehicles is consistent with other uses permitted within the 'M1' Light Industrial Zone.

The existing lot has an access approach from the condo's common element that meets our current specifications. The Developer would be responsible for all costs associated with any alterations to the existing approach.

Water Servicing

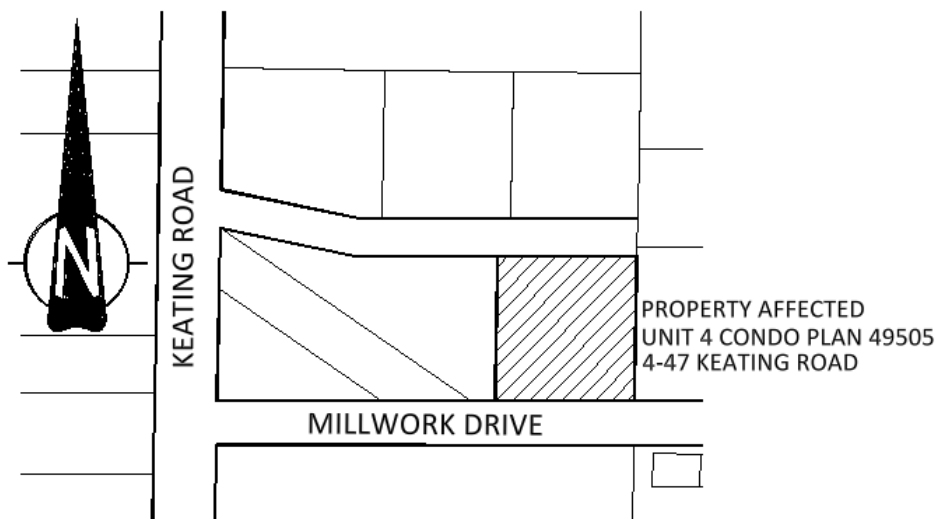

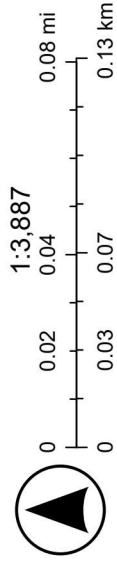

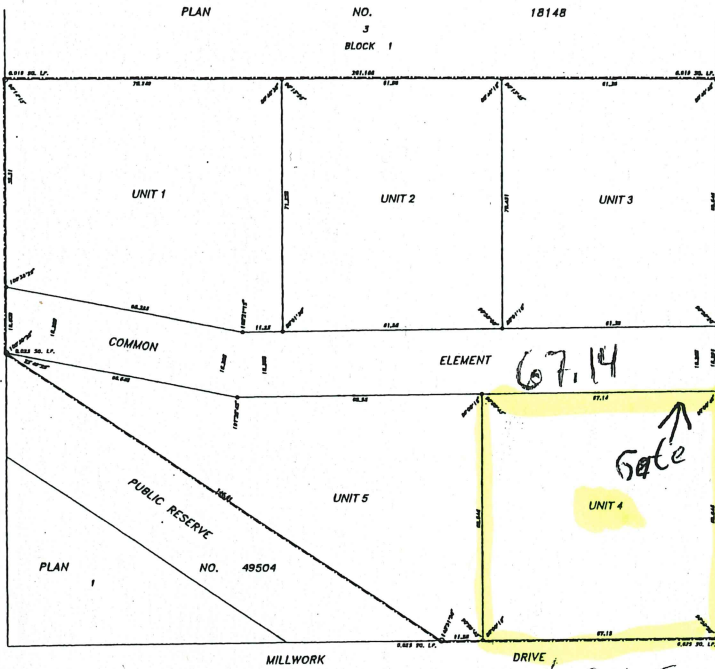

City Manager Report

The application under file CU-2026-06 seeks Council approval to permit a multi-use industrial building on the subject property. The land is zoned as M1 - Light Industrial. A multi-unit industrial building is a conditional use pursuant to Steinbach Zoning By-Law 2245.

The application indicates that the proposed development will be used for storage and personal uses and comply with uses permitted in the M1 - Light Industrial zone.

It does not appear that the proposed uses would negatively impact the surrounding properties. Administration recommends that a development agreement be entered into to help ensure that any future uses continue in compliance with the use-specific standards.

Recommendation is for Council to approve the application under CU-2026-06 subject to the outcome of the public hearing and subject to a development agreement.

Comments/Recommendation

The applicant is applying to permit the construction of a three-unit industrial multi-use building on the subject site. Pursuant to Zoning By-Law No. 2245, an industrial multi-use building is defined as a *'building established to accommodate a range of primarily industrial businesses on a single lot, with individual units that may be rented or subdivided as part of a condominium development'*.

Under the previous Zoning By-Law No. 2100, industrial multi-use buildings were permitted within the 'M1' Light Industrial Zone. However, issues arose where developers constructed the buildings with the intent of leasing the individual units to multiple tenants. Prior to occupancy, tenants are required to obtain the necessary permits to ensure the units comply with the Manitoba Building Code and that the proposed use conforms with the Zoning By-Law. In a number of instances, tenants occupied units and commenced operations without obtaining the required permits or ensuring compliance with City bylaws. Additionally, some of the businesses operating within the units were not permitted uses within the zone.

As part of the recently adopted Zoning By-Law No. 2245, industrial multi-use buildings are now classified as a conditional use requiring Council approval. This amendment was implemented to provide greater oversight of multi-unit industrial developments, ensure compliance with applicable City bylaws, and place greater responsibility on the developer to establish compliant units prior to occupancy.

The current application proposes the construction of a three-bay industrial multi-use building within an industrial condominium development. The applicant has indicated that the bays will be utilized for storage and personal space. The applicant will be required to ensure that all units comply with the requirements of Zoning By-Law No. 2245, the Building By-Law, and all other applicable City bylaws prior to occupancy and operation.

It is recommended that council approve CU-2026-06 subject to any new evidence being presented at the public hearing, and subject to the applicant entering into a development agreement.

RE: Private Property Sewer Infrastructure By-Law & Inspection Program

City Council enacted the City's Sump Pit and Sump Pump By-Law No. 1674 in 2003. This By-Law regulates the installation of sump pits and sump pumps in all buildings constructed in Steinbach since its adoption. The intent of the By-Law is to reduce/prevent the amount of ground water accumulated from a building or site from entering the City's sanitary sewer system.

In response to the significant rainfall events that affected the City in both September of 2024 and September of 2025, both Council and Administration have considered several possible factors that may have contributed to over 200 properties experiencing some type of flooding during these events. A review of these factors is ongoing and a listing of proposed flood mitigation projects and programs has been presented to and explored by Council

As part of the City's 2026 capital program and budget planning process, City Council directed administration to proceed with a construction project for the re-routing of the low pressure sewer force main servicing the Clearspring Greens neighborhood. Work on the planning of that project is ongoing with a tender process expected later this spring.

It has also been recommended that along with this project to amend public infrastructure the City proceed with concurrent policy and program changes affecting private property to form a comprehensive strategy to try to reduce the future flooding risks in Steinbach.

Since the adoption of By-Law 1674, new development is required to properly install a sump pit and sump pumps during construction with the expectation that the sump pit and sump pump configuration adhere to the By-Law requirements. Administration has amended the Sump Pit and Sump Pump By-Law for Council's consideration. The intent of the revised By-Law is to strengthen policy and broaden property owner requirements requiring the installation and on-going unaltered use of sump pits and sump pumps.

Current information suggests that the City's present approach of property owner self-education and self-regulation respecting these requirements is insufficient to achieve a reasonable degree of compliance. The proposed program would further ensure that on-site plumbing configurations for sump pits, sump pumps and septic tank lids comply with City by-laws, policies, and building code requirements.

Sanitary sewer catchment areas within the City that experienced higher than average instances of flooding as compared to other areas of the City would appear to be the most likely areas to begin the inspection and verification program. Inspections in other neighborhoods in Steinbach would follow as time and resources permit. The first phase of the program would be undertaken using City resources. Once the City better understands the results discovered in this first phase, administration may present recommendations through the City's budget approval process if further resources are required.

A key anticipated benefit of this program would be to reduce the potential for storm water infiltration from private properties entering the City's sanitary sewer system, particularly during storm events.

The framework of the program would include notification to property owners of the City's intention to inspect the noted items on their property and, upon the proper documentation being completed, compliance could be verified. Should any deficiencies or improper plumbing configurations be identified, the owner would have an opportunity to undertake corrective measures with compliance confirmed by the City in due course.

If non-compliance is identified and corrective measures are not undertaken, an outstanding work order on the affected property would be issued or other measures required as may be determined under the proposed By-Law. If an order to remedy would be issued, it could be removed once a property has been brought into compliance.

Several years ago, the City approved a Dwelling Safety Standards By-Law and inspection program to regulate residential properties for minimum occupancy safety standards. This ensures that all residential property owners maintain a safe and secure living environment for themselves and their tenants. The proposed program would share this basic framework, notice and follow-up processes as it would be an appropriate fit for the sump pit, sump pump, and septic tank lid inspection and compliance program.

Administration recommends that Council consider implementing a program for the City to undertake a private property inspection and compliance program for sump pits and sump pumps, and to include related components such as septic tank lids for neighborhoods serviced with low pressure sewer.

Should Council approve of these amended policy measures, and adopt the recommended amendments to By-Law 1674, Administration would communicate further details to the public prior to proceeding with the program.

2026 Sump Pump By-Law Update: Summary & Rationale for Draft Changes

Drafted changes to Sump Pump By-Law 1674 (BL1674) are highlighted yellow in the attached draft. At a high level, this by-law update is intended to modernize regulations, clarify nuisance definitions, and strengthen administrative tools for effective enforcement. A summary of changes including rationale is provided here below:

1. Title and Intent

The old by-law (BL1674) was titled the Sump pump By-Law and we are proposing to change that to be the Land Drainage By-Law to reflect the expanded scope of what it covers. The new draft (draft BL2274) addresses water-related property nuisances more broadly rather than just sump pumps on their own.

2. Clarity via Declared Nuisances

- Draft Section 2:

Section 4.2 of BL1674 referenced nuisances but did not provide clarity regarding what constituted a nuisance. Consequently, it has been difficult to address the nuisances declared in section 2 of draft BL2274 outside of informing and educating residents.

In order to better align draft BL2274 with section 232(1)(c) & 233(d) of the MB Municipal act, and to add clarity about what it intends to address for its readers – section 2 “Declared Nuisances” was added. This also enables draft BL2274 to include expanded penalty fine provisions.

3. Inflow and Infiltration Reduction Program

- Draft Section 3.4 & 6:

This is a new provision that would give City Administration the authority to implement an Inflow and Infiltration Reduction Program for the purpose of reducing the amount of clean rainwater/ groundwater entering the sanitary sewer system at a particular property or in a localized area. An I&I Reduction Program would include inspecting private properties to ensure compliance with the by-law.

4. Subsurface Drainage Systems (weeping tiles and sump pumps)

- Draft section 4:

BL1674 has specifications for sump pumps and sump pits that mirror building code in it whereas draft BL2274 requires that all systems be designed and constructed in accordance with recognized engineering practices, applicable building codes, and City of Steinbach Building BL 2105. This change was made to eliminate potential conflicts with future versions of the MB Building Code since the province is now required to accept new versions of Canadian building codes within eighteen months of publication (to comply with the Canadian Free Trade Agreement).

- Draft section 4.1:

Draft BL2274 makes it clear that plumbers and/or homeowners installing illegal sump discharge systems are liable to the fines provided at the end of the new BL. This was added to address plumbers and plumbing

companies that have been indifferent or non-responsive in the past. The associated fine is set higher to encourage contractors and property owners to comply with building code requirements.

- Draft section 5:

Draft BL2274 specifically addresses sump pump discharge nuisances that can result when not configured correctly whereas BL1674 referenced them generally in section 4.2. This section clarifies what constitutes a by-law infraction (for readers/ residents) and enables the City to expand the fine provisions of the by-law.

5. Floor Drains

- Draft section 7:

This section is largely the same except that it includes the ability for administration to exempt pre-existing & unaltered homes where a homeowner is installing a sump pit & provided that a backwater valve is installed as a part of the retrofit. Essentially – the City recognizes that older homes were built this way and it is not the City’s intent to unnecessarily penalize homeowners that want to add sewer backup protection to their homes.

6. Rainwater management (downspouts and landscaping)

- Draft sections 8-10:

BL1674 does not address rainwater management or stagnant water. In the past, stagnant water has been addressed under Junk, Weeds, Nuisance BL no. 1663 - however that BL is only enforceable via “self-help” provisions of the MB Municipal Act and not by way of penalty fines.

Administration’s experience has shown that self-help provisions work well for long grass, weeds, and junk clean-up where no significant alterations to the property are required - but haven’t been effective for nuisance water concerns.

The intent of adding these provisions to draft BL2274 is to give Administration additional tools (primarily penalty fine provisions) to address and correct surface water/ stagnant water related nuisance situations as they arise.

7. Penalties and Enforcement

- Draft sections 11-12:

BL1674 was written before the Province replaced the summary convictions act with the Municipal By-Law Enforcement Act (MBEA) and the Provincial Offences Act (POA) in 2017. Draft BL2274 is written to better align with the updated legislation and so that administration has clear authority to enforce the BL in general. These are standard terms that have been in the last few BL updates that Council has passed.

8. Penalty Fines

Penalty fines are not intended or used for the purpose of generating revenue – they are however often the most efficient and effective tool available for the purpose of gaining compliance with City by-laws, thereby improving quality of life for City residents collectively.

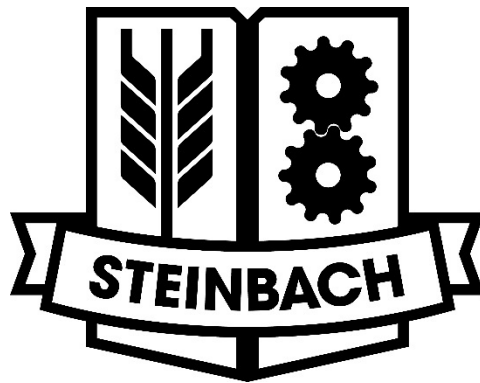

Administration is recommending the following fine provisions under draft BL2274. The cost of rectifying these contraventions can be high and so fines need to be high enough to encourage voluntary compliance. Maximum fine under Manitoba's MBEA is presently set at \$1,000.

LAND DRAINAGE BY-LAW NO. 2274

A By-Law of the City of Steinbach to limit conveyance of environmental water to the sanitary sewer and to reduce nuisances caused by environmental water.

May 19, 2026 – First Reading

June 16, 2026 – Second and Third Reading

WHEREAS Section 232(1) of The Municipal Act, states that, “a Council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- (a) the safety, health, protection and well-being of people, and the safety and protection of property;
- (b) people, activities and things in, on or near a public place or a place open to the public, including parks, municipal roads, recreation centres, restaurants, facilities, retail stores, malls, and private clubs and facilities that are exempt from municipal taxation;
- (c) subject to section 233, activities or things in or on private property;
- (e) private works on, over, along or under municipal roads;
- (h) drains and drainage on private or public property;
- (n) businesses, business activities and persons engaged in business;
- (o) the enforcement of by-laws.”

AND WHEREAS Section 233 of The Municipal Act, states that, “A by-law under clause 232(1)(c) (activities or things in or on private property) may contain provisions only in respect of

- (a) the requirement that land and improvements be kept and maintained in a safe and clean condition;
- (c) the removal of top soil; and
- (d) activities or things that in the opinion of the council are or could become a nuisance, which may include noise, weeds, odours, unsightly property, fumes and vibrations.”

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Steinbach in a meeting duly assembled, enacts as follows:

PART 1: INTERPRETATION

1. Name of By-Law

The name of this by-law, for citation, is the “Land Drainage By-Law.”

2. Declared Nuisances

The City Council of the City of Steinbach declares the following to be nuisances, as determined in the opinion of a City Manager Designate:

- 2.1. conveyance of Environmental Water to the City’s sanitary sewer system;
- 2.2. causing or permitting stagnant water;
- 2.3. causing or permitting deviations from an approved drainage plan;
- 2.4. causing or permitting a rainwater management system, or subsurface drainage system to:
 - 2.4.1. create a hazard on public or private property including, but not limited to:
 - 2.4.1.1. icy surfaces on sidewalks, streets, driveways;

- 2.4.1.2. slippery conditions for pedestrians or vehicles.
- 2.4.2. cause or create ponding, pooling, flooding, or water damage to adjacent lands, dwellings, structures, or infrastructure;
- 2.4.3. drain onto neighboring properties, including drainage across property lines without proper control;
- 2.4.4. overload or impair drainage infrastructure, including, but not limited to storm sewers, ditches, public gutters, or culverts; or
- 2.4.5. result in, or significantly contribute to, a risk of public or environmental harm or prevent the intended functioning of City owned land drainage systems.

3. Definitions

In this by-law:

- 3.1. **Approved Drainage Plan** means a drainage layout, endorsed by a City Manager Designate, which is designed to manage water on a property so that it:
 - 3.1.1. Does not create a nuisance for adjacent properties, and
 - 3.1.2. Does not contribute excess runoff into municipal drainage systems.
- 3.2. **City Manager Designate** means any person authorized by the City Manager to enforce this by-law on behalf of Steinbach City Council.
- 3.3. **Environmental Water** means any water that is present in the environment by way of natural means and that exists in the form of rainwater or subsurface groundwater.
- 3.4. **Inflow and Infiltration Reduction Program** means an official initiative of the City of Steinbach aimed at reducing the amount of environmental water entering the sanitary sewer system. The City may declare an Inflow and Infiltration Reduction Program for the entire City or for specific areas identified by a City Manager Designate. The declaration shall be communicated through public channels and by direct notification via letter mail. The declaration of such a program takes precedence over any exceptions previously granted by a City Manager Designate.
- 3.5. **Occupier** means any person in actual or constructive possession of a property pursuant to a lease, tenancy license or other right to occupy.
- 3.6. **Person** means an individual, firm, partnership or corporation and, where the context requires, shall include the plural as well as the singular.

- 3.7. **Property** means any land as defined in The Municipal Act within the City whether or not there is situated thereon a dwelling or any other building.
- 3.8. **Raingarden** means a garden of native shrubs, perennials, and flowers planted in a small depression, which is generally formed on a natural slope. It is designed to temporarily hold and soak in rainwater runoff that flows from subsurface drainage systems and rainwater management systems.
- 3.9. **Rainwater Management System** means any feature or combination of features—such as gutters, downspouts, rain barrels, cisterns, infiltration areas, grading, land elevations, rain gardens, ditches, swales, or similar structures—designed to collect, convey, store, or disperse precipitation and surface runoff in a manner that prevents nuisance, erosion, or property damage.
- 3.10. **Stagnant Water** means any pond of water that is greater than two inches in depth, in any one location, and that exists at least at that depth for more than 36 hours and is entirely surrounded by land.
- 3.11. **Subsurface drainage system** means any feature or combination of features - such as underground conduits (e.g., weeping tile), sump pits, sump pumps, pumps, French drains, floor drains, discharge pipes, and related equipment - designed to collect, convey, or remove groundwater or soil water beneath or surrounding a building to prevent accumulation, nuisance, or damage.
- 3.11.1. A Pre-existing, Un-altered subsurface drainage system refers to a system that did not include a sump pit and sump pump at time of original construction, or that was constructed before April of 2003.

PART 2: SUBSURFACE DRAINAGE SYSTEMS

4. Subsurface drainage systems shall be designed and constructed in accordance with recognized engineering practices, all applicable building codes, City of Steinbach Building By-Law 2105 and any amendments or successive By-Laws, and this by-law - ensuring that the water level in the sump pit is normally maintained below the lowest point of the weeping tile connection.
- 4.1. For clarity, it is an offence to install any component of a subsurface drainage system that does not comply with the requirements of the Manitoba building code, City of Steinbach Building By-Law 2105 and any amendments or successive By-Laws, and the requirements of this by-law unless a written exception is provided by a City Manager Designate.

5. An owner or occupier of a property shall not knowingly cause, permit or allow the installation, replacement or modification of sump pumps or any other component(s) of a subsurface drainage system in a manner that results in discharge or drainage:
 - 5.1. Into the City sanitary sewer system or any connection thereto;
 - 5.2. onto a permeable ground surface adjacent to a building or structure; or
 - 5.3. in a way that causes a nuisance as declared in section 2 of this By-Law.
6. A City Manager Designate may require pre-existing, un-altered subsurface drainage systems to be altered:
 - 6.1. in order to reduce the amount of environmental water entering the sanitary sewer system by declaring an Inflow and Infiltration Reduction Program;
 - 6.2. where a subsurface drainage system is causing a nuisance at a particular property or in a localized area as determined by a City Manager Designate.

PART 3: FLOOR DRAINS

7. Any floor drain which is connected to a sanitary sewer shall consist of a solid pipe which shall extend from the floor drain trap to the finished floor level with no interconnection between the floor drain and a sump pit or any other component of a subsurface drainage system, or rainwater management system.
 - 7.1. A City Manager Designate may grant a written exemption for an existing, unaltered subsurface drainage system that is being retrofitted with a sump pump, provided that a backwater valve is installed as part of the retrofit.

PART 4: RAINWATER MANAGEMENT

8. An owner or occupier of a property shall not knowingly cause, permit or allow any new or pre-existing component(s) of a Rainwater Management system to discharge or drain:
 - 8.1. Into the City sanitary sewer system or any connection thereto;
 - 8.2. onto a permeable ground surface adjacent to a structure; or
 - 8.3. in a way that causes a nuisance as declared in section 2 of this By-Law.
9. An owner or occupier of a Property may direct any rainwater downspouts, eavestroughs, sump pump discharge pipes etc. towards:
 - 9.1. a raingarden that is able to accept the water without causing a nuisance to neighboring properties;
 - 9.2. the front of the Property;
 - 9.3. the rear of the Property;

- 9.4. a sideyard which does not abut another Property; or
- 9.5. a sideyard which abuts another Property if there is a minimum of 10 (ten) feet of permeable ground between the outfall of the downspout or eavestrough and the adjacent Property - or where they do not cause a nuisance.

10. Where an approved drainage plan exists for a property, the owner or occupier shall not cause, permit, or allow any new or existing alterations to property elevations or other components of the plan that deviate from the approved drainage plan, unless an alternative plan has been submitted to and approved by a City Manager Designate.

PART 5: PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT

11. Penalties

11.1. Subject to the Administrative Penalty By-Law, or a by-law implemented under the authority of the Provincial Offences Act, any person who contravenes or disobeys, or refuses or neglects to obey any provision(s) of this by-law is guilty of an offence and is liable to the fines listed in Schedule “A”.

11.2. Where a corporation commits an offense against this by-law, each person who is authorized, or consented to, connived at, or knowingly permitted or acquiesced in, the doing of the act that constitutes offence, is likewise guilty of the offense and liable to the penalty for which provision is made in section 11.1.

11.3. Where the contravention, refusal, neglect, omission, or failure, continues for more than one day, the guilty person is liable to a separate offense for each day it continues.

11.4. The costs (including legal fees related to the enforcement) of an action or measure taken by the City under this by-law are an amount owing to the City by the person who contravened the by-law, The Municipal Act, The Planning Act, or any other Act the City is authorized to enforce.

11.5. In addition to all other rights of collection which the City may have at law, such amounts may be collected by the City in the same manner as a tax may be collected or enforced under The Municipal Act.

12. Inspection

12.1. A City Manager Designate may enter land/property, buildings or structures at any reasonable time to carry out an inspection, enforcement or action, or

request that anything be produced to assist in the inspection, remedy, enforcement or action taken.

12.2. A City Manager Designate must display or produce upon request identification showing that they are authorized to make the entry.

12.3. A City Manager Designate may take written notes of any violations that may exist, and may take photographic evidence, which will be kept on file.

12.4. A City Manager Designate may conduct any further inspections necessary to determine whether the actions or measures set out in a Notice of Contravention or an Order to Remedy a Contravention have been taken to remedy the contravention or situation, or to prevent a reoccurrence of the contravention.

12.5. It shall be a City Manager Designates opinion and discretion whether a Notice of Contravention or Order to Remedy a Contravention have been complied with.

This by-law shall come into effect upon enactment.

PART 6: REPEAL AND ENACTMENT

The following by-law(s) are hereby repealed:

- Sump Pump By-Law No. 1674 (2003)

CITY OF STEINBACH

By-Law No. 1674

A BY-LAW OF THE CITY OF STEINBACH TO REGULATE THE INSTALLATION OF SUMP PITS AND SUMP PUMPS FOR BUILDINGS IN THE CITY OF STEINBACH.

WHEREAS Council of the City of Steinbach deems it desirable and necessary to establish regulations concerning the installation of sump pits and sump pumps within the City of Steinbach.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the City of Steinbach in a meeting duly assembled, enacts as follows:

SECTION 1 - General

1.1 All buildings located within the City of Steinbach with a subsurface drainage system (the "System") shall have the System constructed so that the drainage is directed to a sump pit equipped with a pump and discharged to the outside of the building in conformance with Section 4 of this by-law.

1.2 The System, which includes weeping tile, sump pit, pump(s) and other associated equipment, shall be designed and constructed in accordance with good design practice, and all applicable building codes and this by-law such that the water level in the sump pit is normally maintained below the lowest level of the weeping tile entering the sump pit and, in the case of power failure, the sump pit shall be at least of the size required by Section 3 of this by-law and shall be large enough to contain water collected from the weeping tile for the System for a period of at least one (1) hour.

SECTION - Sump Pumps

2.1 Sump pump(s) for the system shall be:

- Automatically controlled and set to maintain the water level below the lowest drain tile entering the sump pit;
- Of the centrifugal impeller type;
- Installed with their inlets located at least 30mm (1 1/8") above the bottom of the sump pit;
- A submersible pump; and
- Capable of discharging a minimum flow of 0.751 l/s at 3/6m head.

2.2 Sump pump motor(s) for the System shall:

- Be connected to an electrical circuit that supplies no other outlets or equipment;
- Be designed for up to 10 start/stop cycles per hour;
- Be equipped with a self-resetting thermal overload protective switch;
- Be rated for continuous duty; and
- Be CSA approved for sump pit application.

SECTION 3 - SUMP PIT(S)

3.1 Sump pit(s) shall:

- Have walls and bottoms constructed of either concrete, polyethylene, polypropylene, fiberglass or other suitable material;
- Be provided with a sealed cover adequate to support the occupancy floor load for the building served by the System;
- Have a minimum pit floor area of 0.46 m² (4.9 sq ft) and a minimum depth of 0.8m (30"); and
- The cover of the sump pit must be screwed down, locked or fastened in a manner acceptable to the City of Steinbach.

SECTION 4 - Discharge

4.1 The discharge pipe system for the System from the sump pump shall:

- Be constructed of materials installed in conformance with this by-law and any applicable code;
- Have a minimum internal diameter of 30mm (1 1/8");
- Have a check valve installed near the connection to the sump pump to prevent backflow into the sump pit;
- Have a union joint installed near the sump pump to facilitate sump pump removal and inspection if metallic piping is used; and
- Be protected so as to prevent the freezing of water in the System.

4.2 Discharge of water from the System onto the surface of the land served by the System shall:

- Where, in the opinion of the City of Steinbach, the landscaped area around the building served by the system is adequate to dispose of subsurface drainage without causing a nuisance to adjoining properties, be directed to the outside of the building served by the System and discharged on to a splash pad as specified in Schedule "A" to this by-law.
- Where, in the opinion of the City of Steinbach, the landscaped area around the building served by the System is inadequate to dispose of subsurface drainage and/or where such drainage may result in a nuisance to other properties, the type of System and point of discharge shall be designed in such a manner as is first approved by the City of Steinbach in writing.

SECTION 5 - Floor Drains

5.1 Any floor drain which is connected to a sanitary sewer shall consist of a solid pipe which shall extend from the floor drain trap to the finished floor level with no interconnection between the floor drain and the sump pit.

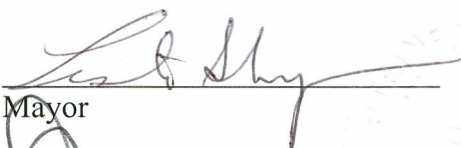
SECTION 6 - Offence and Penalties

6.1 Any person who contravenes or disobeys or refuses or neglects to obey any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) in the case of an individual or Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) in the case of a corporation or in the case of an individual to imprisonment for a term not exceeding six months or to both such a fine and such an imprisonment together with an order in favour of the City, for costs incurred by the City with respect to this prosecution.

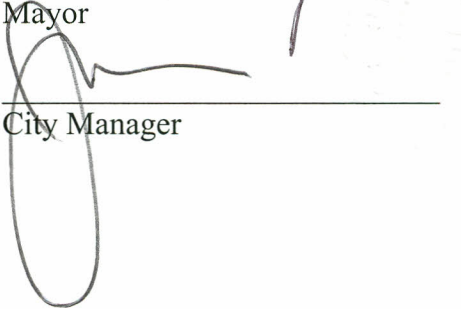
- 6.2 Where a corporation commits an offence against this by-law each Director or Officer of the corporation who authorized, consented to, connived at, or knowingly permitted or acquiesced in, the doing of the act that constitutes the offence, is likewise guilty of the offence and liable on summary conviction, to the penalty for which provision is made in 6.1.
- 6.3 In addition to 6.1 and 6.2 any person or corporation may be required to observe or perform such terms and conditions as a court may impose.
- 6.4 Where the contravention, refusal, neglect, omission or failure continues for more than one day, the person or corporation is guilty of a separate offence for each day it continues.

This by-law shall come into effect upon enactment.

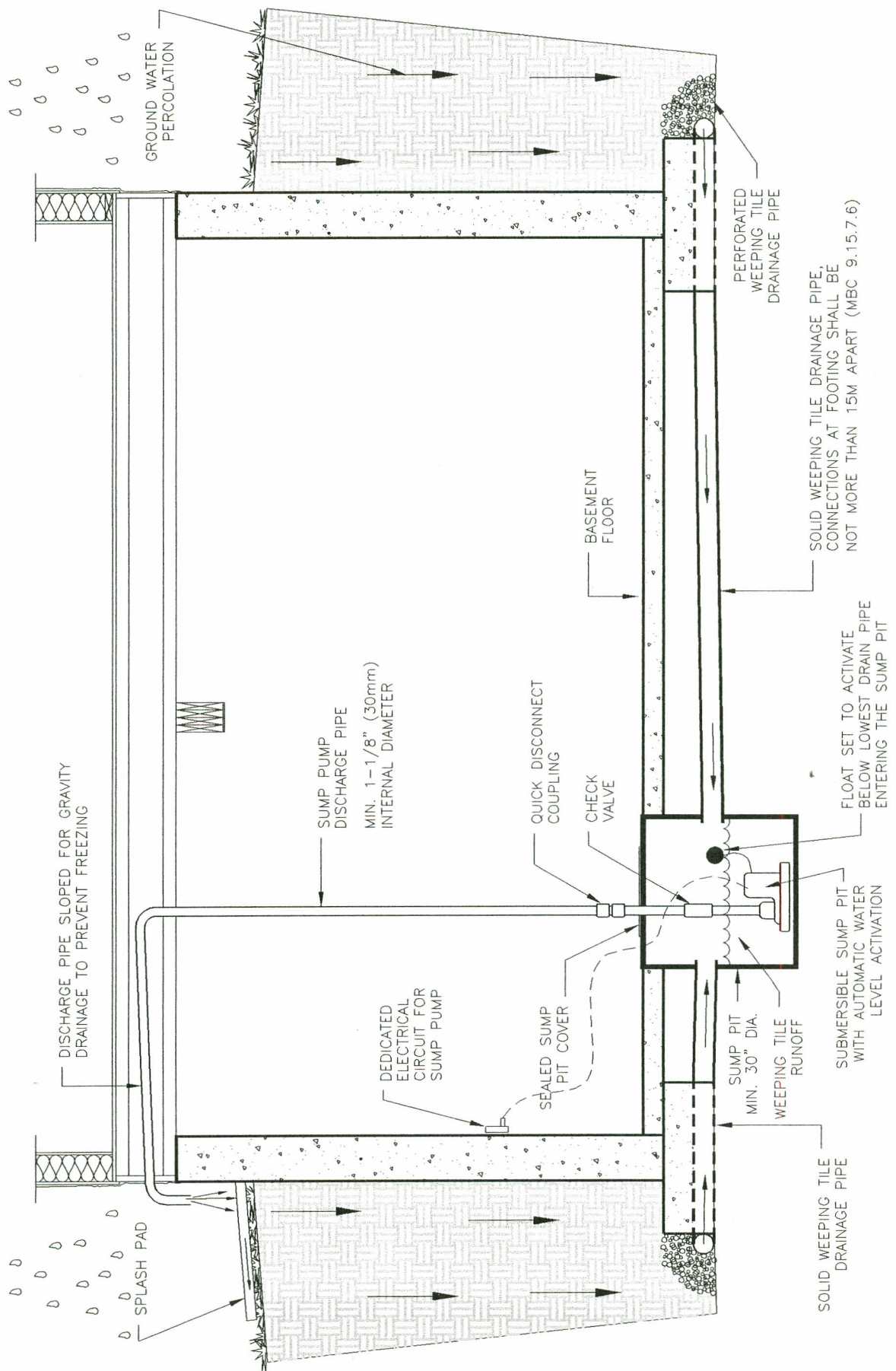

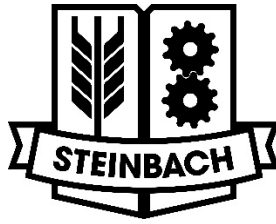

By-Law No. 2282

BEING A BY-LAW of the City of Steinbach to amend the Administrative Penalty By-Law No. 2076 allowing the enforcement of City By-Laws, under the Municipal By-Law Enforcement Act (the “Act”)
