Utility Rate Adjustments

The City of Steinbach has been authorized by the Public Utilities Board (Order No. 137/23) to modify water and sewer rates for consumption starting January 1, 2025. Adjustments to the rates are as follows:

Overall, the rate adjustments are expected to have a minimal effect on residents' utility bills. Steinbach customers continue to enjoy some of the lowest utility rates in Manitoba.

Be part of Steinbach's Lead Sampling Program

Based on the Operating Licence guidelines provided by the Office of Drinking Water, the City of Steinbach completes annual water sampling for lead at various properties across the City. We are currently looking for residents to volunteer their homes to be part of the water sampling process. Participation requires a one-time sampling of two 1-litre bottles to be collected by the resident directly from a drinking water tap on their premises. Sampling will take place between June and October. Priority will be given to older homes and home daycares. Please visit www.steinbach.ca for more information.

Dwelling Safety Standards By-Law

By-law 2157 addresses minimum obligations property owners must provide within their residential dwellings to ensure all Steinbach residents have safe housing. All homes in Steinbach, including secondary suites, must comply with the by-law. A resident or owner can request the City of Steinbach to inspect their dwelling unit. Units in compliance and that pass inspection will receive a Certificate of Compliance, valid for 3 years (unless property conditions change). Learn more at www.steinbach.ca.
